as an **RI** President's representative and a trainer at the International Assembly, training incoming Governors. She served as an **RI** Director in 2014-2016 and until recently was a member of




the Operations Review Committee. She was appointed a TRF Trustee in September, 2017, and is on the stewardship committee. She also is on RI's membership committee.




